


- Location 3-6th floor of the Student Services Center (9th & San Fernando Street)

 - *Expected Range* **\$5-\$8/day parking** (payable at Pay Stations, License Plate # Required)
 - OPTION #1 Park Mobile App
 - 1. Register at: <u>https://parkmobile.io/</u>
 - 2. Once registered, enter the zone number located on stickers and signs on meters or choose from nearby zones shown.
 - **3.** Choose your parking duration.
 - 4. Confirm your information, including location, license plate, time and cost.
 - a. **Please Note:** Entering your vehicle information correctly is vital to the process. If you enter your vehicle information incorrectly (especially your license plate), you may be subject to a ticket. So, please double check your information to make sure it is correct.

5. A ticker will be displayed counting down your time remaining. You can extend your session remotely.

• **<u>OPTION #2</u>** - Pay for parking on the day of the conference

- Pay station: Located on the 1st floor near elevators
 - 1. After parking your vehicle, take note of your license plate number. Go to the pay station located on the 1st floor by the elevators


Campus Map




Full Campus Map
